IIT Ropar Student Welfare Account Welfare Fund

- 1. To help the students for entry fee / fees towards medical, sports, mess and hostel fee, research, innovation due to financial constraints / low income / BPL / No source of income / any other reason if the Committee feels it appropriate.
- 2. Medical Treatment: Medical treatment in a Govt./ Private hospital (empanelled by IIT Ropar) during his / her course at IIT Ropar after exhaustion by the insurance company and subject to availability of sufficient fund can be considered as per following:
 - a. For private hospitals in cities with a population up to 10 Lac: upto 40% amount of actual bills including medicines upto one month of the date of discharge from hospital.
 - b. For private hospitals in cities with a population above 10 Lac: upto 50% amount of actual bills including medicines up to one month of the date of discharge from hospital.
 - c. For private hospitals in cities with population above 30 Lac: up to 60% amount of actual bills including medicines up to one month of the date of discharge from hospital.

In all these cases there will be no legal right of the candidate to seek any claim. Dean SA / ADSA or other Competent Authority will only be the final deciding Authority.

Only up to 1 Lakh or 25% of the total available fund can be used by a single student in an academic year whichever is minimum.

- 3. In case of Mess & Hostel fees: Up to maximum 50% of the fee will be covered.
- 4. In case of sports, research and innovation fee, the Committee may take appropriate decisions looking at the merit of these items and availability of the fund.
- 5. Injury due to non-compilation / violation of hostel rules will not be covered.
- 6. It may be requested by HMC to transfer 50% of the amount of 'fine' collected per annum whenever required in this fund. (The Student Affairs Section will transfer this amount for FY 2022-23 w.e.f. April 2022)
- 7. In case of any discrepancy, the decision of the Student Welfare Fund Committee consisting of Dean SA, Chief Warden, ARSA and President Student Council will be final.
- 8. The candidate shall first explore the reimbursement from Insurance Company if he / she has purchased any policy in addition to the Group Medical Assurance and Group Personal Accident Policy through Institute (whichever is applicable at the time) and other private and Government agencies. If required, this fund will be given as an additional support.
- 9. Institute reserves the right to make amendments in this policy and fee at any time.
